In 2019, Ann Gilardi Johnson, ASLA, our Generous Gardeners' volunteer landscape architect, created complementary designs for the city to update and improve the plaza for the Fishermen's Memorial. This included curved stone benches and flower beds. The design was implemented in 2021, but the Memorial improvements lacked the four bronze sculpted planters that were a key, albeit expensive, element of the proposal.

Generous Gardeners worked with the city and state over the past two years to garner support and lobby for funds to complete Ann's vision. We are pleased to report that these planters will be a major legacy project for Gloucester's 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Native resident and world-renowned sculptor, Chris Williams, will be creating these unique pieces. The planters are ocean-themed, because the sea and the harbor are the magnets that brought all of us to this wonderful location. Generous Gardeners commissioned one of the bronze sculpted planters which has been partially funded with a designated gift from local businessman, Mike Nocella.
